### Acrostic Poem

The first letter of each line is uppercase and forms a word. The word is the subject of the poem.

White fluffy snow all around Ice skating is fun to do Need to wear a hat and gloves Trees have lost their leaves Enjoying hot chocolate Really cold outside







#### Haiku Poem

This is a traditional form of Japanese poetry made up of 3 lines. The first line has 5 syllables, the second has 7 syllables, and the third has 5 syllables again. It is usually written about one simple thing like an animal, season, or nature.



<u>Line 1</u>: 5 syllables <u>Line 2</u>: 7 syllables Line 3: 5 syllables



Yellow and black stripes. Bees go flower to flower. Watch out they can sting!

### Tanka Poem

This form of poetry is very similar to a Haiku poem except it has 7 lines. It has a 5-7-5-7-7 syllable count. It is usually written about nature, seasons, love, sadness, or any other strong emotion.



<u>Line 1</u>: 5 syllables <u>Line 2</u>: 7 syllables

Line 3: 5 syllables

<u>Line 4</u>: 7 syllables

Line 5: 7 syllables

## Cinquain Poem

A cinquain poem consists of 5 lines arranged in a special way. The first line is the topic of the poem and each line describes it.

Line 1: 1 noun

Line 2: 2 adjectives

Line 3: 3 -ing action words

Line 4: 4 word phrase or feeling

Line 5: 1 synonym for your topic
